Dear Nurse Candidate,

The nursing programs at Arizona State University and Grand Canyon University provide a variety of nursing career options, one of which is the opportunity to become an officer in the elite Army Nurse Corps.

The Army Nurse Corps is an elite Corps made up entirely of BSNs, nearly a third of who have earned their master's degree. All Army nurses take annual courses in their chosen specialty and many pursue their master's degrees while taking advantage of the Army's tuition assistance programs.

Becoming an Army Nurse through Army ROTC provides you with officer leadership training while you earn your BSN. There are also numerous scholarship opportunities. In fact, over 85 percent of Army ROTC nursing cadets are on a 2-, 3-, or 4-year scholarship.

I have **SCHOLARSHIPS** available at ASU and Grand Canyon University's Samaritan College of Nursing (a private, Phoenix Nursing School). I am prepared to offer you:

- **100% TUITION** at either ASU or Grand Canyon University.
- **\$900/year** towards books and lab fees at school.
- **\$450** (junior year) and **\$500** (senior year) **MONTHLY** tax-free stipend.
- **\$2500 - \$5000 BONUS** upon entry into your upper division of the Nurse Curriculum – based on your CGPA.
- **Nurse Summer Training Program** – a 3-week, 120-hour clinical rotation in an Army hospital working one-on-one with an Army nurse preceptor/instructor.
